EXPANDING OUR NETWORK

Soon after the pandemic, we actively re-engaged with clubs in North Wales. We currently have member clubs including boxing clubs, football clubs and youth clubs in Anglesey, Conwy, Denbighshire, Flintshire and Wrexham. We are planning on securing sustainable funding to place an officer in North Wales to coordinate our projects and programmes. Our intention is to develop our network in North Wales to open up and create more opportunities for the young people in the North.



The New Dragons Speech and Language Club in Flintshire offers a safe, friendly, and stimulating environment for young people. We focus on fostering friendships, improving communication and social skills, all whilst having fun!

We are actively seeking partnerships with organisations in North Wales to expand our network and provide young people with valuable programmes, resources, and support.



YOUNG PEOPLE'S VOICE

As the General Election was called earlier, we organised the "Not Your Usual Hustings" Event and it was held in a trampoline park on 27th June 2024 with a strapline "Jump Into Politics". It was well attended by over 72 young people across Wales, a majority of these young people were from marginalised groups and would not generally engage in any sort of politics or recognise the importance of why they should. They submitted their questions prior to the event and met with 6 politicians from different parties face to face, and asked their questions on the topics of education, health, transport, care issues, homelessness, home schooling and youth work.



On 25th March 2024 young people and youth workers from BGC Wales visited the Houses of Parliament to attend the award ceremony which is hosted by Mr Speaker and The Rt Hon Sir Lindsay Hoyle MP.



Not Your Usual Hustings 2024, funded by the Welsh Government Democratic Engagement fund, partnered with Deryn and Swansea MAD, that was held in Trampoline Park, Bridgend in June 2024.

INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGES

We believe international exchange programmes offer numerous benefits for young people include cultural awareness, global perspective, language skills, interpersonal skills networking opportunities, and more – that's why we have been doing it for two decades and we continue to do so. **Taith** is Wales' **International Learning Exchange Programme** that supports activities that would have previously been funded by the Erasmus+ programme. Taith provides opportunities for young people, staff and volunteers at Welsh youth organisations and local authority youth services.



In 2023-2024, we organised 7 international mobilities with 220 participants, 3 advanced planning visits, giving us a total of 12 different mobilities in 7 countries including Canada, France Spain, Germany, Netherlands and the USA.

50 participants from both
countries took part in a variety
of fun activities throughout the
15 day including cultural
excursions, and collaborative
projects.



Four exchange visits were organised to strengthen our organisations in Wales and give Youth Workers and Volunteers a full insight into youth work practices abroad. These visits took place in Montana, Seattle, Orlando and Atlanta, offering valuable learning experiences in different settings.



OUTDOOR ACTIVITIES

It is all about personal challenge, not a race. Participants call on their skill, determination and stamina to achieve many of our outdoor adventure activities. The achievement brings a sense of personal fulfilment that will remain with the individual for life. These events are an extended opportunity to undertake quality youth work with a group of young people who will be pushing themselves to achieve. It is not easy and requires effort which in turn leads to the reward of completion and satisfaction.



23 enthusiastic young people, supported by 8 experienced and trained staff, participated in this year's challenging 100-mile Canoe Test along the scenic River Wye in 2024.



We are incredibly proud of our young people. Their dedication, resilience, and exceptional teamwork have truly shone throughout this experience, demonstrating their hard work and commitment in every aspect of the program.



Survival Day Adventures provided Police Youth Volunteers a chance to build teamwork and **skills** through survival scenarios, stretcher and shelter building, dam creation, and learning plant uses for environmental sustainability.



RESIDENTIAL CENTRE

We are delighted to introduce **The Lodge**, our specialist residential centre tailored to meet the diverse needs of young people through personalised residential visits. At The Lodge, guests can take part in a wide variety of activities designed to promote adventure, wellbeing, and personal development. Our programme includes exciting adventure activities, wellbeing workshops, and team-building sessions that encourage camaraderie and resilience. Young people can explore bushcraft skills, while nearby outdoor pursuits include BMX riding, GoApe high ropes courses, surfing, mountain biking, scenic mountain and coastal walks, and quad biking. Additional activities include stargazing, geocaching, and a flexible space to host sports groups.

POLICE YOUTH VOLUNTEER

BGC Wales is delighted that South Wales Police has partnered with ourselves, the Council for Wales of Voluntary Youth Services (CWYYS), Cardiff Metropolitan University and University of Wales Trinity St David's to enhance the delivery of the Police Youth Volunteers (PYV) Scheme. The four-year agreement funded by the Police and Crime Commissioner marks an exciting new chapter for the scheme which works with young volunteers aged between 14 and 18. The PYV scheme is part of a police uniformed youth group recognised throughout the UK. It aims to encourage the spirit of adventure and good citizenship and inspire young people to participate positively in their communities and it also delivers volunteer work which helps support local policing priorities.







The Police Youth Volunteering (PYV) Scheme is a programme in which young people aged 14-18 can get involved and build on a variety of skills. The scheme has five main objectives which are as follows;

- To encourage the spirit of adventure and good citizenship.
- To support local policing priorities through volunteering.
- To give young people a chance to be heard.
- To inspire young people to participate positively in their communities.
- To promote a practical understanding of policing amongst all young people.



ESYTN AND STRATEGY



We are delighted to share with our friends, supporters and club leaders our excellent Estyn inspection that was recently undertaken. The inspection was the pilot voluntary youth work inspection in Wales and took place in March 2024.

We were really pleased that Estyn was able to speak with young people, club volunteers, staff members and trustees to hear their accounts of how effective the organisation is at supporting young people.

Whilst we are delighted with the inspection report, the hard work continues so that the organisation can better support member clubs and young people.
